Who Goes First? (continued)

Honors (For Information Only) :

- Player who had the best score on the prior hole hits first.
- First Hole toss tee in air between foursome
 Player who tee points to goes first
 Repeat for remaining three players





"Ready Golf" speeds play

The Player who is ready first, hits first!As long as it's safe to do so

Advise other players you will be hitting
Make sure no one is in the line of play
Or in range of possible errant shot





🏶 Keep play moving by hitting while other players search for lost ball

Ready Golf



Where do you stand when others are teeing off?

- Stand to the right and slightly behind the tee
- Do not stand directly behind the person hitting
- If player hitting off the tee is left-handed
 - Leave extra room behind them to swing comfortably
- If cart path runs along the left side of the tee
 - Stay on left side again slightly behind the tee markers
 - ✓ Leave extra room

On the Tee....







Give extra room to left-handed players



Where do you stand? (continued)

On the Green

- Out of the line of sight (including peripheral vision)
- Never stand directly behind a player
- Or on the extension of their line of putt

How to conduct yourself on the Green

Never walk in another player's line of putt!



Handling the Flagstick

- Player whose ball is closest to the pin on the green pulls the flagstick
- Place the Pin gently on the ground away from the line of putt of all players.
- Player who holes out first, replaces the flag.
- Ask if player wants flag tended







Tending the Flagstick

- Hold top of flag (so it doesn't flap in the wind)
- Stand so shadow doesn't cover the line of putt
- Stand on low side of hole
- Remove flagstick as soon as put is struck











How to conduct yourself on the Green

Always mark your ball on the green
Place mark behind ball on line to hole
Then lift ball (and clean if desired)
If your ball marker is in another player's line of putt – ask if she wants it moved

Marking the ball



Two balls on the same line



Moving a mark on the green

- Place mark behind ball and lift ball
- Line up putter head with tree, bush or other fixed object
- Place putter head to side of mark
- Move mark to opposite side of putter head
- Place marker upside down as a reminder.....
- To reverse process and return mark to original spot before putting!











Taking Care of the Course# Always repair your ball marks!



Insert repair tool on side of hole



Gently – lift tool toward hole to fill in center of hole



Repeat around all sides of hole



Until mark is filled



Tap down on grass to smooth repaired mark



Always replace or fill divots


Pick up divot and replace it in damaged area



Tap down replaced divot with foot to smooth fairway



Taking Care of the Course (cont.)

All about bunkers:

- Enter and Exit bunker from the low side
 Smooth foot prints with foot
- Rake over foot prints walking backwards out of bunker















Pace of Play

- *** Keep up with the group in front of you**
- * Know when to tee off (foursome is halfway down the fairway and unreachable)
- Pick up at double par on every hole
- Practice continuous putting
- Mark scores on next tee-box





Pace of Play (cont.)

No more than :

- One practice swing (only if it helps)
- ✓ 30 seconds to hit (less if scoring over 90 for 18 holes)
- Track other players balls
- One minute to look for your ball
- Other players should hit first and then assist in search for ball
- Know your distance before you get to your ball

Pace of Play (cont.) Check markers for distance on your way to your ball



Black & White Striped Pole usually represents 150 yards to center of green



Pace of Play (cont'd)

Place carts on way to next tee

Avoids having to walk back for them When group behind is waiting to play

Consider calling up players behind you on par 3's

- ✓When all players in your group are on green
- Mark balls and move behind green
- Allow group behind to hit their tee shots
- Putt out while group behind walks to their balls

Never leave carts in front of green!



Motorized Golf Carts

- **Keep them at least 30 feet away from the green or water hazards**
- Never bring them on hills leading to green or on fringe around green
- Don't drive on steep hills, on mounds or near bunkers and water hazards
- Obey cart signs

Motorized Carts (cont'd)

 Par 3's are often "Cart Path only"
 90 degree rule – or "Cart Path Only" on entire course may apply after a rainy day or course maintenance





Pull Carts

Keep carts off tee-boxes Never bring a pull cart onto the green surface!!!









Courtesy Counts!

- **Be quiet and still on the Golf Course :**
 - ✓No Cell phones!
 - Do not talk while others are hitting
- *Yell "FORE" LOUDLY if the ball is headed towards someone
- If your shot ends up on someone else's fairway always let them hit first.
- Never yell or complain to golf course staff!!

Odds & Ends

Place extra clubs on top of flagstick or on way to your bag/cart so you don't forget them



More Odds & Ends

Never touch another player's ball without permission

- Make sure to place an identifying "mark" on your ball
- Mulligans and gimmes don't exist

(That's called "Man Golf")

Whiffs count!
